Ideal for the southeastern United States, as it tolerates both the summer heat and humidity unlike other yews, 'Duke Gardens' has a dense spreading mounding habit. Japanese plum-yew works well in small spaces, a woodland or shade garden as an accent or planted in mass along a border.

Excellent tolerance for both shade and hot weather make this species an interesting substitute in the southeastern U.S. for true yews (<i>Taxus</i>) that usually struggle south of USDA Zone 7. Accent, group or mass. Excellent evergreen conifer for shady locations in the landscape.

It grows slowly and will reach 6 feet in 10 years with a 3-4 foot spread. Latin for gracilis translates to "graceful." Grows best in full sun but tolerates light to dappled shade. It will adapt to most soil types except wet poorly drained ones. Keep soil moist first year and once established the tree is fairly drought tolerant. This tree prefers some protection from the wind. This graceful tree makes a nice accent or specimen tree, a corner of the house plant or planted in small groups. It can also be grown in containers..

One of the first Japanese nurserymen who visited here some years ago, Mr. Yamaguchi of the Gifu Prefecture, has a specimen of this growing in his garden which is a tight upright conical form. Really quite impressive, but best to be grown in morning sun and afternoon shade or filtered shade. Do not put in very dense shade as with var. hondai.

It produces utterly pretty, tutu-like, soft pink, semi-double to fully double, non-fragrant flowers that are medium large, 7-9 cm wide, with yellow stamens in the centre. Blooming depends on plant's age – the older the plant the more buds. It can bloom for 4-8 weeks from late November.
